5 6	Preamble
7	The faculty of the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New Orleans (LSUHSC-NO),
8	within applicable laws and policies of the Chancellor of the LSUHSC-NO, the President of the LSU System,
9	and the Board of Supervisors of the Louisiana State University and A & M College, do hereby effect
10	through this Constitution the Faculty Senate of the LSUHSC-NO.
11	through this constitution the racially senate of the Escribe 110.
12	Article I. Name.
13	Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Faculty Senate of the LSUHSC-NO, hereinafter referred
14	to as the Senate.
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16	Article II. Purpose.
17	Section 1. To serve as a representative voice of the faculty.
18	Section 2. To provide a means of communication between the faculty and the Chancellor and the
19	Administration staff of the LSUHSC-NO.
20	A. The Faculty Senate, subject to the powers vested in the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO, shall:
21	i. consider and make recommendations concerning all matters of general interest, as
22	distinguished from those affecting a single school;
23	ii. review and approve all changes in existing policies or the establishment of new
24	policies relating to matters of general LSUHSC-NO interest when these
25	policies are brought to the Senate for consideration by the Chancellor of
26	LSUHSC-NO or by its own members or constituencies;
27 28	iii. consider and make recommendations on any matters referred to it by the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO or by its own members or constituencies.
28 29	B. Any recognized group within the LSUHSC-NO community shall possess the privilege of
30	presenting suggestions or raising problems for consideration by the Faculty Senate or by any
31	of the ad hoc committees of the Senate. The "LSUHSC-NO community" shall mean those
32	eligible for membership in the Senate as individuals, as well as, groups whose members are all
33	eligible for membership in the Senate.
34	Section 3. To accept and share responsibility with administration and students in all efforts to improve the
35	stature and to accomplish the mission of the LSUHSC-NO.
36	Section 4. To communicate with the faculty assemblies or faculty organizations of the Schools of Medicine,
37	Dentistry, Nursing, Allied Health Sciences, Graduate Studies and Public Health at LSUHSC-NO.
38	Section 5. To communicate with the faculty senates of the other colleges and universities within the State of
39	Louisiana.
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41	Article III. Jurisdiction.
42	Section 1. The Senate may hear, consider, and advise the Chancellor of the LSUHSC-NO and his/her
43	administration on any matter of concern.
44	Section 2. The Senate, upon its request, may be furnished by the Chancellor of the LSUHSC-NO information
45	appropriate to its consideration in such a matter.
46 47	Article IV. Membership and Term of Office.
47 48	Section 1. Members of the Senate shall be selected/elected by the respective faculty assembly or faculty
40 49	organization within each School by whatever procedure they approve, provided that such procedure
5 0	yields Delegates who comply with faculty representation as set forth in this Constitution and Bylaws.
51	Jeres Deregues who comprise that hours representation as set form in this constitution and Dynaws.

52	Section 2. For purposes of selecting Senators, eligible faculty are those full-time faculty with academic rank		
53	of Instructor or above as defined by the schools, excluding those administrators, deans, department		
54	heads, and any others whose functions are primarily administrative.		
55	Section 3. Membership in the Senate shall be determined by proportional representation, in accordance with		
56	the formula provided in the Bylaws.		
57	Section 4. A Senator may be recalled, as determined by the faculty assembly or faculty organization bylaws		
58	of each School.		
59	Section 5. The term of office of a Senator shall be three academic years, commencing at the first Senate		
60	meeting following his/her election.		
61	Section 6. Senators are eligible to serve no more than two consecutive terms. [Senators elected to an initial		
62	one or two-year partial terms shall be eligible to succeed themselves at the conclusion of their initial		
63	term for one additional term.]		
64	Section 7. Approximately one-third of the members of the Senate shall be elected each year. The terms of		
65	office shall be staggered.		
66	Section 8. The Senate shall be the sole judge of the qualifications of its members and shall have the power		
67	to review any contested election.		
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69 70	Article V. Meetings.		
70 71	Section 1. The Senate shall meet in regular monthly sessions.		
71 72	Section 2. Special meetings of the Senate may be called as stipulated in the Bylaws.		
72 73	Section 3. Rules governing the conduct of regular and special meetings shall be as stipulated in the Bylaws.		
73 74	Article VI. Officers.		
75	Section 1. All officers of the Senate shall be elected members of the Senate.		
76	Section 2. Officers of the Senate shall be the President, the President-elect, the Secretary, an elected Faculty		
70	Representative (see Article VIII, section 2), and an Alternate Faculty Representative.		
78	Section 3. The officers of the Senate shall be elected in accordance with the Bylaws.		
79	Section 4. The officers of the Senate shall discharge their duties as stipulated in the Bylaws.		
80	Section 11 The officers of the Senate shall alsonaige their duries us suparated in the Dynamot		
81	Article VII. Executive Committee.		
82	Section 1. The Executive Committee of the Senate shall consist of the President, the Past President (ex-		
83	officio), President-elect, Secretary, and the Faculty Representatives to the LSU System.		
84	Section 2. The duties and responsibilities of the Executive Committee shall be as stipulated in the Bylaws.		
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86	Article VIII. Elections.		
87	Section 1. Members of the Senate shall be selected during the first half of June of each year by such means		
88	as the respective faculty assemblies vote to approve.		
89	Section 2. Officers of the Senate shall be elected by secret ballot at the June meeting of the Faculty Senate		
90	as the first order of business.		
91	Section 3. Two Faculty Representatives to the LSU System will be elected by the Senate to serve two-year		
92	terms (with their terms staggered if possible). The Representatives may be a senator or a past		
93	senator, but should by definition be eligible for election to their respective faculty assemblies. The		
94	maximum service period of the Representatives shall be two consecutive terms. It is encouraged		
95	that these offices of the Senate will rotate among the various Schools representing LSUHSC-NO.		
96	Section 4. If a senator in the second year of their current term is elected to the office of President-elect, then		
97	the term of that senator shall be extended to include a fourth year during which they, as President,		
98	will serve as member-at-large. When the President becomes a member at large, his/her original		
99 100	senate seat will become vacant, at which time the respective faculty assembly will elect a new		
100	senator to serve a 3-year term as stipulated in the Bylaws. Should the President-elect senator be re-		
101	elected to a second 3-year term in the Senate by their respective faculty assembly, that senator will		
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103	serve as President during the first year of their second term and the term will not be extended		
104	beyond 3 years.		
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106	Article IX. Committees.		
107	Section 1. The Chancellor, President, Executive Committee, or any Senator shall have the right to ask for		
108	the formation of an ad hoc committee to address or study any issue that impacts the faculty, staff or		
109	students of the LSUHSC-NO. Examples of committees that have been empaneled in the past, or		
110	served as standing committees, include:		
111	A. Professional Rights, Responsibilities and Faculty Welfare Committee		
112	B. Research Committee		
113	C. Education, Service, and Patient Care Committee		
114	D. Constitution, Bylaws, Resolutions, Nominations and Elections Committee		
115	E. Facilities, Safety, and Security Committee		
116	F. Information Technology Committee		
117	Section 2. Ad hoc committees shall:		
118	A. Formulate and recommend actions and policies for approval by the Senate.		
119	B. Be available to consult and advise the Chancellor and Administration of the LSUHSC-NO.		
120	C. Study matters assigned to them by the Senate or the Executive Committee, and consider written		
121	requests of faculty.		
122	D. Seek factual information and the opinions of interested parties prior to any final action on a		
123	matter, and		
124	E. Report to the Senate at each regular meeting, if requested.		
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126	Article X. Amendments.		
127	Section 1. Any proposal to amend, alter, or repeal the provisions of this Constitution shall be initially		
128	supported by a simple majority vote of the Senate.		
129	Section 2. Any such proposal shall be made at least one regular meeting preceding that at which the vote on		
130	ratification is taken.		
131	Section 3. Proposed amendments shall require ratification by a two-thirds vote of the total Senate.		
132	Section 4. The procedure for amendments shall be as stipulated in the Bylaws.		
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134	Article XI. Interpretation.		
135	Section 1. Provisions of this Constitution and Bylaws, whenever unclear, ambiguous, or indefinite, shall be		
136	subject to interpretation by a simple majority vote of the total Faculty Senate.

239	report to the Senate on relevant developments and proceedings.
240	iii. Provide this information in summary form so that it can be disseminated to the presiding
241	officers of each faculty assembly or faculty organization of the LSUHSC-NO.
242	Section 2. Term of Office. The term of office for the senate President, President-elect, and Secretary shall
243	be for one twelve (12) month period, running from July 1 (beginning of the school fiscal year
244	following the June election). The term of office for the Faculty Representatives to the Council of
245	Faculty Advisors shall be two years. The Secretary and Faculty Representatives may serve two
246	consecutive terms.
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248	Article III. Executive Committee.
249	Section 1. Meetings. The Executive Committee shall confer prior to each regular meeting of the Senate
250	and prepare an agenda for that meeting.
251	Section 2. Duties. The Executive Committee shall:
252	A. Make certain that any proposal submitted by a Senator shall be considered by the Senate,
253	B. Distribute an agenda to all Senators at least 4 days prior to all regular meetings of the Senate, and
254	C. Prepare a yearly calendar of meetings of the Senate, stipulating the deadlines for submitting
255	proposals to be included in the agendas.

309	Section 8. Procedures on Proposals other than Amendments. The following procedures shall be used		
310	for all proposals to the Senate:		
311	A. Proposals for consideration by the Senate must be submitted in writing to the Executive		
312	Committee at least two weeks before the next scheduled meeting of the Senate. This		
313	provision may be waived only if the Executive Committee interprets a proposal to be an		
314	emergency.		
315	B. Each new proposal shall be read to the Senate during the portion of the meeting devoted to new		
316	business.		
317	C. After each proposal is read, the Senate shall consider establishing an ad hoc committee of the		
318	Senate to address it. Debate on the question shall be limited to five minutes for proponents		
319	and five minutes for opponents.		
320	D. If a majority of the Senate present approve, the President shall assign the proposal to the		
321	appropriate ad hoc committee of the Senate. If less than a majority of the Senators present		
322	approve, the proposal shall be dropped.		
323	E. At the next meeting of the Senate, the ad hoc committee of the Senate shall make a full report of		
324	its studies on the proposal and state any alterations or objections that it feels advisable to		
325	make.		
326	F. After the ad hoc committee of the Senate has completed its report, the Senate shall debate the		
327	question of adopting the proposed recommendation. Amendments may be submitted from		
328	the floor.		
329	G. The failure of an ad hoc committee of the Senate to make a report at its appointed time shall not		
330	preclude the right of the Senate at that time to move, debate, adopt, or reject the proposed		
331	recommendation or a variation of it.		
332	H. A proposed recommendation shall not be adopted as a recommendation of the Senate unless it		
333	receives the vote of a majority of the Senators present.		
334	I. A minority report may be filed by a Senator(s) who does not vote with the majority.		
335	J. If the Executive Committee interprets a proposal to be an emergency, the proposal need not		
336	be referred to an ad hoc committee, and a recommendation may be introduced, drafted,		
337	and adopted during the same meeting at which it was proposed. If passage before the		
338	next scheduled meeting is critical, the process may proceed electronically (see Section		
339	9).		
339 340	K. The Chancellor or his/her designee, at his/her discretion, may submit items to the Senate for		
340 341	discussion and/or request to address the Senate.		
341	Section 9. Voting Procedures. Voting shall be by show of hands or without objection at all in-person		
342 343	meetings. A roll call vote is required when requested by any Senator. A secret ballot requires a		
343 344			
344 345	majority vote of the Senate. If the Executive Committee unanimously deems an issue to be an emergency, a proposal may be introduced, drafted, discussed, and voted upon electronically		
343 346			
340 347	between Senate meetings. At least five business days must be allowed for voting following		
	circulation of such a proposal, and passage requires a vote in favor by a majority of the total		
348	Senate. In addition, any Senator may table voting on the proposal until the next Senate meeting.

350	Article VII. Amendments.		
351	Section 1. Amendments to this Constitution or its Bylaws shall be made at regular meetings of the		
352	Senate.		
353	Section 2. The following procedure shall be used when an ad hoc committee determines after		
354	due deliberation that an amendment to the Constitution or Bylaws is needed:		
355	A. The general nature of the proposed amendment shall be announced to the Senate and an		
356	affirmative vote obtained from a majority of the Senators present in order to proceed.		
357			

358	B. At the next meeting of the Senate, the ad hoc committee shall present a draft of the proposed
359	amendment and the rationale behind it, after which the Senate shall debate the proposal.
360	Amendments to the proposal may be submitted from the floor.
361	C. A draft incorporating any necessary changes raised in the discussion will be circulated to the
362	entire Senate and the President of the faculty assembly or faculty organization of each
363	School at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which any voting on the amendment is
364	to occur.
365	D. At the next meeting of the Senate, the Senate shall debate the question of adopting the
366	amendment. Modifications to the proposal may be submitted from the floor.
367	E. After debate, the proposal shall require a two-thirds vote of the total Senate membership to be
368	enacted.
369	Section 3. The following procedure shall be used for any individual Senator to directly propose an
370	amendment to the Constitution or Bylaws:
371	A. To propose an amendment, a Senator must notify the Secretary of his/her intentions in
372	writing at least three weeks prior to the next regular meeting. A copy of the proposal
373	shall be included in the call for the next regular meeting and a copy shall be sent to the
374	President of each School's faculty assembly or faculty organization at least ten days prior
375	to the next meeting.
376	B. At the next regular meeting, the President of the Senate shall read the proposal and call for
377	preliminary debate that shall be limited to five minutes for proponents and five minutes
378	for opponents.
379	C. For the proposal to be admitted for further consideration after preliminary debate it must be
380	supported by a simple majority of the Senators present, pursuant to Article X, Section I
381	of the Constitution. Without this support, the proposal shall die for lack of support.
382	D. Upon a proposal's being admitted for further consideration, the President of the Senate shall
383	refer the proposal to an ad hoc committee of the Senate for further study.
384	E. At the next meeting of the Senate, the ad hoc committee shall make a full report of its studies
385	on the proposal and state any alterations or objections that it feels advisable to make.
386	F. After the ad hoc committee has completed its report, the Senate shall debate the question of
387	adopting the proposal. Amendments to the proposal may be submitted from the floor.
388	G. The failure of the Committee to make its report at the appointed time shall not preclude the
389	right of the Senate at that time to move, debate, adopt, or reject the proposal or a
390	variation of it.
391	H. After debate, the proposal shall require a two-thirds vote of the total Senate membership to be
392	enacted.
